



Women in Measurement ResearchHER Program 2024 Call for Proposals

Women in Measurement is proud to offer a ResearchHER program. Our ResearchHER program offers support for outstanding research aimed at advancing our understanding of race and gender issues in our field. The award is intended to promote women-led research that advances the mission of Women in Measurement. Example research topics of interest could include, but are not limited to:

- Documenting the lived experiences of an underrepresented group of professionals in educational measurement.
- Interviewing equity and human resource experts to develop recommendations related to corporate policies that advance diversity, equity, and inclusion.
- Surveying the Women in Measurement community to capture experiences and preferences related to alcohol at professional networking events.
- Reviewing the literature on the success of affinity group mentoring programs for supporting gender and racial equity.

The ResearchHER program is designed to amplify and support the work of women scholars and students. We do everything within our power to help find rewarding, and well-publicized dissemination outlets for our ResearchHERs. In addition to receiving the award and presenting their work publicly, our Women in Measurement ResearchHERs become part of a community that meets regularly to connect, share updates on research projects, and seek guidance and feedback.

For our 2024 ResearchHER program, we will select up to two Women in Measurement ResearchHERs, each awarded with a prize of \$5,000. The award is intended to support the researcher and cover any costs associated with attending a conference for research dissemination. Use of the awarded funds is at the complete discretion of the researcher and no budget needs to be submitted with the proposal. The award will be provided in two parts, \$2,000 upon acceptance and \$3,000 upon completion.

The proposal should contain the following information:

1. Project title
2. Researcher biography including country of residence (200-word limit)
3. Project abstract (200-word limit)
4. Project description (800-word limit) that includes:
 - a. An introduction that emphasizes the connection between the proposed research and the mission of Women in Measurement
 - b. Research questions
 - c. Methodology and data sources
 - d. Implications for the field
 - e. A project timeline that includes publicly presenting the research findings by April 2025.

All proposals are due to researcher@womeninmeasurement.org by **11:59pm on May 31, 2024**. Women from marginalized communities are especially encouraged to apply.
